I would like to thank the service men and women, family and community members who attended our Call to Remembrance on November 9<sup>th</sup>. At a moving presentation organized by Mme. Isert and orchestrated by LT students, we were fortunate to have two special guests address everyone assembled. Lieutenant-Colonel Jim Gash took time to give a historical overview of Canada's role in both combat and peace keeping missions over the past one hundred years. Retired Air Force Captain Dan McIsaac, a descendent from the Cree First Nation, spoke about the role of Indigenous people in Canada's war efforts over the years and sang a verse of the Honour Song. The message both men expressed were congruent with the theme of peace in the poems read by students and the song sung by Mr. Bohaychuk. Several guests commented on the respect shown by LT students during our assembly. That is a testimony to you - the parents/guardians and the LT community at large. Thank you.
