At Home Learning Update 2
Dear LT Families,
Tomorrow, we will be moving to At Home Learning. Two schedules have been attached: one for our grade 6 s and one for our grade 7 s and 8 s . Each homeroom will follow their regular schedule in terms of subject areas and use these schedules for Instructional Periods/Blocks to join their Google Classrooms.

Two terms families and students may hear from their teachers is synchronous learning and asynchronous learning. Here are the definitions for these two terms:

| Asynchronous <br> communication | Communication that does not occur at the same time, with a possible lag or <br> gap between providing the information and the recipient taking in the <br> information and providing a response. <br> Examples: email, messaging, discussion forums, posted videos, complete <br> online tasks, assignments, projects. |
| :--- | :--- |
| Synchronous <br> communication | Real-time communication. <br> Synchronous communication should take a variety of forms depending on the <br> instructional purpose. The range should include individual, small group, and <br> whole class. <br> Examples: video conferencing, phone conversations, conference calls, face-to- <br> face, scheduled/planned individual/small-group support. |

## Grade 6s

Students in Grade 6 will be expected to receive 3 hours of instruction/work daily. Of these 3 hours, about 40\%-50\% of this time will be with their teachers (Synchronous). For example, here is one instructional blocks pulled from the attached schedule:

| Period | Time | Mins | Teacher |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 1 | $9: 15-9: 55$ | 40 | Instructional Time |

During this period of 40 minutes, students will join their Google Classroom and spend 15 to 20 minutes with their teacher (Synchronous). The remaining time will be for students to work independently, or with other students to complete their work (Asynchronous). Teachers will remain in the Google Classroom and be available for support. Teachers may also ask students to return at the end of the Period to wrap up.

## Grade 7s/8s

Students in Grade $7 \& 8$ will be expected to receive 4 hours of instruction/work daily. Of these 4 hours, about $30 \%-50 \%$ of this time will be with their teachers (Synchronous). For example, here is one instructional blocks pulled from the attached schedule:

| Block | Time | Mins | Teacher |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| $\mathbf{1}$ | $\mathbf{9 : 1 5 - 1 0 : 0 5}$ | $\mathbf{5 0}$ | Instructional Time |

During this period of 50 minutes, students will join their Google Classroom and spend 15-25 minutes with their teacher (Synchronous). The remaining time will be for students to work independently, or with other students to complete their work (Asynchronous). Teachers will remain in the Google Classroom and be available for support. Teachers may also ask students to return at the end of the Period to wrap up.

## Learning Support Teachers

Learning Centre, Resource, Student Support, and other supports will continue. These teachers will reach out to their students and families to share their schedules with them. These teachers will be available during the Instructional Time, and often be available during asynchronous times for additional support.

## Student / Family Support

We would like to remind families that if they need support from LTJH, do not hesitate to reach out to us during this time. This could be for academic, social or emotional support. LTJH staff you can reach out to include: your child's teacher, School Counselor Lenore MacDonald, Vice Principal Andrea Doucette, Principal Derek Ferguson or any other trusted adult.

Students will
